

Rules :

1. Tournament Format

International Pro-Am – 72 holes Stableford format, 18 holes per day.

Handicaps:

Amateur players must present a valid and up-to-date handicap index.

The maximum handicap considered for stroke calculation is capped at 36.0.

Strokes received are calculated according to WHS handicap rules.

2. Team Composition

Each team consists of:

- 1 professional player (PGA or other status recognized by the organization)

- 3 amateur players

3. Rules of Play

The competition will be played according to the R&A Rules of Golf, the local rules of the host club, and the specific rules set by the Pro-Am organizers.

Decisions made by the tournament committee are final and not subject to appeal.

4. Tie-breaking

In the event of a tie, the tie will be broken based on the best score on the last 9 holes, then the last 6, 3, and the final hole if needed (net score).

If the tie persists, a draw or a precision contest may be used (to be defined by the organizers).

5. Golf Carts

All players may use a golf cart, subject to availability. If the number of carts is limited at a given course, priority will be given to players holding a medical certificate.

6. Tee Markers

White: Professionals

Blue: Female professionals

Yellow: Senior professionals

Yellow: Male amateurs

Blue: Male amateurs over 70

Red: Female amateurs and senior female professionals

7. Practice Rounds

Players are not allowed to practice on any course they still have to play; doing so will result in disqualification.

8. Scorecard Submission

Scorecards must be signed by at least one amateur player and the professional. They must be submitted to the scoring committee within 15 minutes of completing the round. Any delay may result in team disqualification.

9. Prizes

Prizes will be awarded to the best net and gross teams. Individual contests (longest drive, closest to the pin) will also be held daily. No cash prizes will be awarded to amateur players.

10. Weather Policy

If play is suspended (signaled by an intermittent sound), all players must stop and mark their ball.

If one or more teams in a group are unable to complete their round—regardless of which round—the course will be neutralized for the overall standings.

11. Image Rights

Participants agree to the use of photos and videos taken during the event for communication purposes (social media, press, sponsors, etc.).

12. Insurance and Liability

Each player participates at their own risk.

The organizer accepts no responsibility in case of theft, loss, injury, or accident occurring during the competition.

Personal insurance is strongly recommended.

13. Acceptance of Regulations

Registration implies full and unconditional acceptance of these regulations.

14. Prize Fund for Professionals

A fixed prize of €1,200 is allocated to each participating professional player.

This amount is guaranteed, regardless of the number of participants or the player's result.
